Biography Much Untertrifaller

Born in 1959 and grew up in Bregenz. After high school, he began to read at Vienna's Technical University, to find an important teacher in Ernst Hiesmayr. As of 1982, he worked together with his father, master builder Much Untertrifaller sen., and won competitions in 1984 for the school in Hard, the Vorarlberg Power-Plant Headquarters in Weidach and many others. Together with other architects' work, the Silvretta House upon Bielerhöhe Heights (1992) set the first, internationally recognised sign for a turn in alpine building trends and was internationally applauded. Together with Helmut Dietrich, Much Untertrifaller won a competition for the extension of the Bregenz Festival Opera Hall (1992), the first in a series of large-scale projects to be developed from 1993 in their joint office, Dietrich | Untertrifaller Architects, Bregenz.

Together they finished the new Cityhall in Vienna 2005, the first school in wood with passivhouse-standards in Europe "Hauptschule Klaus" 2003 and received the foremost architecture award in Austria, the "Clients award 2003" for their museum project "inatura" in Dornbirn, which they designed in cooperation with H. Kaufmann.

At the moment the office is working on the project ETH-Sportscenter in Zurich (CH) and on several residential buildings in Switzerland, so that they started with an office in St. Gallen (CH).

The second phase of construction of the Festival Opera Hall at the Lake of Constance will be finished in July 2006.
